And finally, it includes a commitment to share the gospel wherever we have influence through our financial support of missions and evangelism, through Our own personal testimony and witness, and through the use of spiritual gifts we have been given by the Holy Spirit for the building up of Christ’s body on earth, the church.

Our commitment to our Lord is publicly demonstrated and symbolized through baptism by immersion, and by continuing participation regularly in the divine services of the Lord’s Supper and the Ordinance of Humility.
